Texts

Children's mobile phones

On Monday, all staff had further training on safeguarding matters. We are living in a society that poses many risks to our children, and parents now face many new challenges. The use of social media and how children communicate using technology is becoming more evident. During the training staff were told of cases within Wales whereby children had suffered / been exposed to some form of harm from inappropriate use of games/social media/video sites.

Many children told us they had new phones for

Christmas. Last term, a list of apps and their suitability for children and the risks they pose



were included in the newsletter. This was to help you keep your children safe. If you need any further advice please let us know. As school is informed of any further apps that cause concern we will let you know.

We would recommend that all our parents make regular checks on their child's phone. Ensure you, as the adult, has the password to that phone and checks could be made without notice. Ensure your child knows that

these checks are only to keep them safe from outside harm. The children are taught in school how to keep safe online and they are taught how to access help if needed.

Dentist visit

The dentist came into school this week to check the children's teeth. You may have received a note from the dentist if your child needs treatment. Please ensure your child is taken to the dentist and then regular appointments are essential for your child's health and well being.

If the children would like to bring pencil cases for their work in class they can do so. Pens will need to be back ink only. Children will need to be sensible, otherwise, they will be asked to leave their equipment at home. Bringing their own equipment prepares them for year 7 when this will be expected.
