Reading	Parents would like a reading evening	School must ensure they fulfill this promise.	
Christmas carol service	Happy with service but would like a nativity / whole school event	Agree. Once the school is out of special measures this can become a bigger event .	
Newsletter	Good communication	Parents need reminding how they can access, including paper copies.	
PTA	More parents would like to get involved	Meetings to be arranged at different venues and at different times to ensure all parents have an opportunity to attend. School to ensure PTA news is sent out once a month.	
Charity events	Mixed views. Some feel that school should make big event of national events. Others feel that events have an effect on family finances and School should consider this.	School to consider the nature and amount of national events and expense for parents.	
Attendance	This is a parent responsibility at primary school. School to consider rewards for classes without identifying pupils with poor attendance.	Open to suggestions and will consider reward system.	
Reasons for absence	Why are parents requested for medical evidence?	School explained that this is due to parents giving many medical reasons for absence. When a child is ill on many occasions it is important that their health is investigated. School ensures that the child is seeing a doctor and parent is seeking medical advice regarding health. Most children who enjoy a healthy lifestyle are present most of the time.	
Punctuality	Shocked about the amount of pupils that are late arriving. Again a parent responsibility. Suggestion that parent are invited to meeting at the school.	Open to suggestions. School will initiate parent meetings	
Reading books	Not all classes are ensuring that books are sent home.	School to remind teachers. Books to be sent home daily. Parent to return daily.	
Homework	Variety of views in this issue	School to consider, putting emphasis on how homework meets the needs of all pupils.	
Behaviour	On the whole - positive though particular times were identified	School to address this. School keen to finalise Behaviour policy.	
After school clubs	Request for more maths, reading and writing clubs. So successful that more is needed. Children are seeing the benefits and enjoying the clubs.	School to consider how this can be addressed.	
Suggestion box	For parents to voice their views. An alternative option.	School considers this a good idea and will act on this.
