Great Start Back

We have had a great start to the term. The children have settled well and it is so good to see them back again with lots of indications that we are very unlikely to close again. Infection rates are decreasing and with more adults having being vaccinated everyone is feeling safer again. Happy days! However, it is still important that we follow the Welsh Government rules. It is these rules that have helped lower risks and reduce the spread. Now the

weather is improving we can meet outdoors more and that is helpful for everyone to socialise again, but please avoid meeting indoors as it does put our school at risk if it comes into school from the community. We are continuing with all our safety measures that were put into place when infection rates were high and the risk assessment is on our website also. The local authority have informed us that we must remain operating with the Welsh Government guidelines to ensure that we all continue to keep safe. They will inform us when restrictions around school operations can be lifted. We know that children are low risk and adults at the school are taking all precautions to ensure they keep safe and also protect your family unit. All staff are wearing masks and are tested for covi-19 twice a week. All is good and lets hope it stays that way!

We are still unable to use the hand driers so paper towels are in place. We are speaking to the children about the need for hands to be dried properly. If you can do the same at home this will be helpful too.
