
Dinner money

We are finding it increasingly difficult to chase up so many families who have not paid for their child's dinner. At certain times during the term, if the money is not paid, the local authority removes it from the school budget. As I know you will understand, this is not in the best interests for the school. It is your responsibility as parents to ensure that your child has food. You can either chose for them to have packed lunch or you can choose to buy a school meal if you are not eligible for a free school meal. If you choose for your child to have school food then this needs to be paid for on the day. To put it into context, if you go to a cafe / restaurant for food you would need to pay there and then, and school is exactly the same.

Please can you ensure that you send money into school for your child's dinner. Ideally, it makes sense for you to pay on the Monday for the week, however, if this is not possible then we are prepared to take money in each day. Money needs to be sent in for your child's school food. If you forget to pay, just ring the school so we can make arrangements for your child to be provided with something to eat.

Obviously, on safeguarding grounds, we would be concerned if a child was not provided with a lunchtime meal. It is parents responsibility to ensure that their child has food. Although schools provide arrangements for parents to buy food the responsibility lies with parents. School is unable to pay for food unless your child is eligible for free school meals.
