IMPORTANT - lockdown - 'fire break'

A fire break is meant to slow down or stop the progress of a fire that spreads quickly. The director of education has asked all headteachers to pass on the message to families about keeping safe over half term.



From 6pm today:

People must stay at home, except for very limited purposes, such as for exercise.

People must work from home wherever possible;

People must not visit other households or meet other people they do not live with either indoors and outdoors:

No gatherings will be allowed outdoors;

All non-food retail, hospitality businesses, close contact services and events and tourism businesses, such as hotels must close:

Community centres, libraries and recycling centres will be required to close.

Good hand hygiene, keep a 2m distance from anyone outside your household, wear face covering when in public places

What if you or a member of your family tests positive next week?

It is important that you let us know so we can help track and trace let others know if they have had contact.
