How is the internet and technology affecting your child?

The development of technology has changed modern society. There are positive and negative effects and it is important that you consider this with your children. Research is now available for us to see how technology and the internet affect children's learning, wellbeing, communication and social interaction. There are definite positives including entertainment, research, tutorials, interaction, increased skills in subjects, creativity, problem solving and much more. However, there are disturbing negatives such as compulsive use and addiction, increased stress and anxiety, worries about self image, loneliness, bullying, access to pornography, exposure to racism, grooming and hate speech, headaches, obesity, eye strain and much more. As parents in today's world we have to consider this research to safeguard our children. Please ensure your child uses technology and the internet to support their development and nothing else. There are many children who are starting to suffer negative effects for technology usage. Please don't let it happen to your child. Suggestions:

- notice how your child reacts when using their device, are they happy / sad / cheerful / anxious / angry / laughing?
- Balance online activities with real world experiences - indoors and outdoors.
- Talk to your child about how they manage their social networks - communicating with friends.
- Ask your child what's the best and worst thing about being online / gaming etc
- Do some research yourself on how to support your child and how to talk to them about their feelings e.g. childnet resource.

Please remember - your child relies on you to keep them safe. They trust you to do what is best for them. Be safe not sorry. If you are in any way worried contact us at school and we will access the appropriate advice. We don't have all the answers but we know people who do!
